Labor Acknowledgement





Establish a multi-year framework and 1-year strategic plan to address how we will collectively prevent and end homelessness in Summit County by March 2025.

<u>Together</u>, we will co-create:


- ✓ A strategic framework for preventing and ending homelessness in Summit County
- ✓ A near-term *action plan* for the Summit County Continuum of Care that will provide guidance to SCCoC staff, leadership, and member agencies.
- ✓ A "North Star" for local providers and collaborators

National "North Star" Performance Goals

- Reduce the number of people experiencing homelessness
- Reduce the number of people becoming homeless for the first time.
- Increase the number of people exiting homelessness into permanent housing.
- Reduce the length of time persons remain homeless.
- Reduce the number of persons who return to homelessness after exiting homelessness to permanent housing.
- Increase successful placements from street outreach.

Ultimately, our goal is to make homelessness <u>rare</u> and <u>brief</u>.

- I am because you are when I look at you, I see me. Kapwa and Ubuntu



What is a Strategic Framework & Action Plan?

A multi-year foundation for collective action, with periodically updated near-term action plans:

- ✓ Vision Statement: defines our common purpose and shared aspiration (future-state)
- ✓ Guiding Principles (or values): defines our shared values relative to fulfilling our vision and universal goal
- ✓ Collective Goal (or mission): general statement of how we will achieve our vision.
- ✓ Population-Specific and Cross-Cutting Goals: statements related to specific subpopulations (e.g., families with children) and cross-cutting issues (e.g., income/benefits) that further describe how we will achieve our vision
- ✓ Strategic Action Plan: approaches and actions we will take to achieve each goal over the next 1-2 years


